International Women's Day 2022 - Break The Bias

Tuesday 8 March is International Women's Day and this year, the theme is Break The Bias.



Mayor Kate Hanson said it's important to have diversity on council and encouraged other women to consider being a part of local government. "I believe there should be more diversity in local government and that includes a greater representation from women in decisionmaking roles," Cr Hanson said. "It's very important to me and was a driving force behind my wanting to be on Council.

"I'd encourage other women to step forward, and if you're nervous about taking that step, seek information from other women especially those in the roles you aspire to. "There are many great female leaders in our region who are a fantastic resource. If you're interested in local government, I'd encourage you to speak to female councillors and get a few different perspectives - together we can Break the Bias."



Councillor Marg White was motivated to run for Council after considering the culture change required to 'break the bias' and achieve true gender equality, which she saw as a major challenge for all levels of government and the community at large. "Reflecting on the notion of 'unconscious bias', I realised I had spent a lot of my working life in meetings and forums where I became increasingly aware of the struggle to have women's voices heard," Cr White said.
