Questions Received Verbally at the Meeting

Tim Cobb, Skenes Creek

My question is about the Apollo Bay to Skenes Creek Coastal Discovery Trail. We are shortly going to be putting in a Small Town Improvement Plan application for \$25,000 to Colac Otway Shire and we already have \$50,000 committed from the Coast Committee, the Chamber of Commerce, the Skenes Creek Association and from Sports & Recreation Victoria. It was strongly suggested at our community meeting on Saturday by Sarah Henderson that we apply for a grant under the Building Better Regions Fund. It would really strengthen our application if we could get a commitment from Council, ideally of \$25,000. The catch is that the program closes on 31 March. Would Council consider committing \$25,000 to this project if we get a Building Better Regions grant? We could double our money by getting a matching contribution from the Federal Government and that would enable us to not just do the feasibility study, but move all the way to the position where we're getting close to shovel ready, which means that in future we could apply for an Infrastructure grant.

Response from General Manager, Corporate Services

As you are aware, we were made aware of the request last night. Certainly, I understand the importance of that particular project to the community and the timing sensitivity around whether we can apply to that. Council's in its budget process at the moment, so we'll certainly take your request and work with Councillors to be able to get back to you as quickly as we can, understanding that the time sensitivity around this is basically next week. We can then give you an answer as to whether we can commit to that, or otherwise. We'll be in contact with you again in the next couple of days.

Jenny Cunnington, Barwon Downs

My maiden name was Curtis, which I'm sure you're well aware of by now. Are Council aware that the people that live in that one house on the one track don't want Malhoff left there either? They want it changed. Are you aware that they want that changed to Curtis?

Response from General Manager, Corporate Services

We received a notification from the Historical Society that came through to Council last Thursday, and that was forwarded to all Councillors. That came in after the agenda was issued.

Are you aware Mr Malhoff's son went to war? I had four Curtises go to war, one of them in a Prisoner of War camp for four years, so if that's an issue, then the Curtis name is up there with everybody else. Were you aware of that?

Response from Deputy Mayor

I think we're aware of it now. Thank you for your comment.

Ken Willows, Forrest Historical Society President

When the Committee was formed and Councillor Smith and I were both on that Committee in 2008 to name over 150 unnamed roads in the shire, we thought this would turn out to be a good opportunity, but unfortunately a mistake was made and a name was given to the road which referred to a small property just further up the road with its own access. Why is the shire so reluctant to change the name and correct this mistake which is of great concern to the community and the family? Why can't it be changed?

Response from General Manager, Corporate Services

Tonight the proposal is put before Council to consider what they can do with the roads. Certainly Council is free to make a decision to do that. The officers have made a recommendation but that is for Council to consider tonight and make a determination of what the next steps will be in relation to that road.

Phil Lawson, Apollo Bay

As a follow-up to Tim Cobb's question, Apollo Bay, Marengo and Skenes Creek have just got one commercial centre. If a family at Skenes Creek just want a litre of milk and a student has to go and get it, there's no way they can safely get from Skenes Creek to Apollo Bay; they have to walk or ride their bicycle on the Great Ocean Road, which is very busy. We really do need walking tracks and bicycle tracks from the three centres to the one commercial centre. I'd like the Council, when they're reviewing the idea of supporting this, that they must ha a policy about safe travel of students and any other relevant things in terms of having a good community, in terms of supporting Tim Cobbs' question. My question is to consider that, and I'm sure you will.

Tony Webber, Otway Forum

Has the lease agreement for Heathfield Reserve been signed?

Response from General Manager, Infrastructure & Leisure Services

It hasn't yet been to Council. I expect that it would come to Council either at the April meeting or perhaps the May meeting.

There's been reports that the rates differential between Colac and the rest of the shire will be equalised, so all the rest of the shire will be 100% the same as Colac shire, the cents in the dollar. If this happens, the rates in Apollo Bay and other areas will probably go up around 15-17% in one go. That won't be very popular, so I'd like to ask is this being considered?

Response from General Manager, Corporate Services

Council is in the process of developing the budget at the moment and that includes working through allocation of funding for grants and supporting different projects, including looking at rating. At this stage there has been no decision about any changes to rating. Council will propose to adopt a draft budget in April and at that stage it will be made clear if there are any changes proposed.

Neil Cunnington, Barwon Downs

In relation to the Curtis road issue again, I'm not sure that you're aware that Curtises actually built that road; it was their farm. The Malhoffs had nothing ever to do with it. I just want to make sure you're aware of that.

Response from Deputy Mayor

Thank you. I think that was in the report. That's been made clear to us.

Tony Webber, Apollo Bay

The Lavers Hill Progress Association has been corresponding with the government over weeds and the weeds are particularly bad this year because we've had a wet summer, particularly ragwort. The letter that came back said that there was a community-led program run by the shire. Is that the case? I would like to ask the shire if they would possibly work with Landcare and maybe try to get some funding out of the State Government in a joint proposal?

Response from General Manager, Development & Community Services

Council is not developing a community-led program for weed control with the Southern Otway Landcare Network (SOLN). Council understands that SOLN is continuing to correspond with State Government about seeking funding to establish a community-led weed control program. Council will assist SOLN in this effort by providing letters of support for the program to assist SOLN with its advocacy to State Government for funding.
