Questions Received in Writing Prior to the Meeting

Tim Cobb

 Will Colac Otway Shire commit to apply for a Transport Accident Commission grant to provide a pedestrian refuge at Skenes Creek? Does the proposed 2016/17 budget include allowance for this and if not, why has the Council decided not to address this issue?

General Manager Infrastructure & Leisure responded that VicRoads is the responsible road authority for the Great Ocean Road and would need to apply for any grants for these works. Council is currently working with the Skenes Creek Advancement Association and VicRoads to develop a strategy to improve pedestrian safety along the Great Ocean Road at Skenes Creek. Proposed actions from the working group will assist in determining future strategies and funding opportunities, for example, a Transport Accident Commission grant, which would enable the implementation of safety improvements. This project has been included for consideration within Council's Road Safety Improvement Program, with project prioritisation currently being finalised for the 2016/17 work schedule.

2. Is the state actually spending the \$0.8m to maintain the Apollo Bay Harbour Asset or does the figure of \$0.8m mean that the asset is projected to depreciate (i.e. run down in value) by \$0.8m over the year 2016/17?

General Manager Infrastructure & Leisure Services responded that the \$800,000 referred to in the budget is the projected depreciation expense, for accounting purposes. The actual Port of Apollo Bay budget is developed annually in consultation with the Department of Economic Development, Jobs, Transport and Resources and includes a forward Capital Works plan which is grant funded and not funded by Council.

Phil & Marg Lawson

1. Why is access along Nelson Street to the Harbour considered so unimportant as a footpath route and is there any prospect of a formal pedestrian access to the Harbour being constructed in the next few years?

General Manager Infrastructure & Leisure Services responded that Council's Apollo Bay Commuter Footpath Strategy and the Active Transport Strategy guides future footpath improvements and renewal for Apollo Bay. Council has identified challenges in the road reserve where Breakwater Road meets Trafalgar Street, and Council has developed an outline design to address the issue. Council is currently facilitating the Apollo Bay Development Plan Expression of Interest process and the scope of this project will encapsulate the Breakwater Road, road reserve. Council is awaiting the recommendations of the Apollo Bay Harbour Development Plan project before committing funds to capital improvements and would schedule any agreed capital works accordingly.

Questions Received Verbally at the Meeting

Tony Webber – Otway Forum

1. We've got the proposed harbour reference group being appointed today. How many people applied?

General Manager Development & Community Services responded that there were invitations for nominations for that committee and 29 nominations were received.

2. The Heathfield Reserve has been around since 1990 and there's been no lease agreement for the use of that land and I think that Council should have had a lease on that agreement, even at \$1,000 a year, we would have money set aside now to do something with that ground. Would Council consider conditions very carefully when giving a lease agreement, because it is public land. If there is cattle and a lease agreement, there is potentially no access to the public. Some of us feel that it should be used for fodder and it's good to cut hay and maybe only have limited access at certain times for the cattle, so will the Council consider that as very careful conditions for that lease?

General Manager Infrastructure & Leisure Services has taken the question on notice.

- 1. Why after much hindsight from that experience, it being such a contentious and sensitive nature of the issue of Bushfire Attack Level ratings, has this Council allowed its ratepayers of Wye River and Separation Creek to once again be subjected to a similarly grossly inaccurate report by the same fire consultants?
- 2. Why did this Council not support and stand up for its ratepayers against the State government's somewhat dictatorial approach to this fire overlay with full knowledge that it would add huge cost to building?

Manager Bushfire Recovery responded that the state government has undertaken a number of different studies to try and make it easier to rebuild after the fires which Council has supported and we have worked closely with government to assist in those studies being undertaken. The one relating to bushfire looked at establishing Bushfire Attack levels for all properties affected by the fires, so that individual owners wouldn't need to do their own assessments. The 2014 Terramatrix study that Council had commissioned using State funding, was done at a time when the Bushfire Management Overlay had different standards for construction and those standards

changed. The results of the Terramatrix study that was done with government this year in response to the fires now shows less properties that would be subject to Flame Zone than what there were under the previous study, which is a good outcome for Wye River and Separation Creek. Terramatrix have undertaken that work according to the standards that are there for people when they assess their own properties for a bushfire management study. They are bound by the requirements to follow the same methodology that individuals would if they were doing that study for their own properties.

In respect to fast tracking applications, whilst people that are within a Flame Zone will need to build to a far higher standard than perhaps they might have a house previously, every effort will be made by Council in assessing those applications to treat them in a very streamlined way.

The Mayor responded that Council is not in a position to deal with this, this is clearly a State government issue. We have said to them what we want is a very clear and concise set of rules to deal with as soon as we can. We have been given one set and we are now looking at some way of helping people in individual situations without changing the rules.

Cr. Delahunty returned to Council chambers at 4:19pm

Sheryl Smith - Wye River

1. Will the Mayor, as Chair of the Community Resilience Committee, make the minutes of their meetings available to the people you say you represent?

General Manager Bushfire Recovery responded that the minutes of the Community Resilience Committee do go on the WyeSep Connect website following ratification by the committee, so there should be one set of minutes up there at the moment. The committee has met twice and had a workshop last week and just to clarify, this is not a decision making body, it's an informative body.

2. Will the Mayor, as Chair of the Community Resilience Committee, make the Resettlement Plan available to those people it affects?

General Manager Bushfire Recovery responded that the Resettlement Plan is on the agenda today for the Council to endorse and make it publically available for the community. It's a plan that will transition and continue to evolve, but as of now it is on Council's website and it will be on the WyeSep Connect website very shortly.

3. Will the Mayor, as Chair of the Community Resilience Committee, undertake to talk directly to the permanent residents about our needs for recovery?

The Mayor responded that we certainly will and we are having a meeting next Saturday, so there will be a full update on where we are at and also there's some more sub-committees being investigated through the Community Resilience Committee. They will go out into the community and seek more information from locals.

The CEO responded that the she has just checked the WyeSep Connect website and the minutes of the Community Resilience Committee are on there, just look under the 'CRC' section. In terms of the Community Resilience Committee, I think it's fair to say it is just getting started, there have been two meetings. The first meeting was about establishing the work program and what the objectives are and what success looks like in a general sense. I know that the community members of that committee have met with the community specifically in a community only meeting Saturday week ago. They are really just starting to find their feet in terms of working with the community. Where they are now is not where I will anticipate they will be very soon. It's no problem to take this feedback to them, they are in constant contact with the organisation so it's not a problem to let them know that the permanent residents would like to see more commitment from the committee to maintain and establish direct contacts.

Yvonne Francis - Apollo Bay

1. If Geelong magistrate Ann McGarvie granted bail, why is Mr. Paul Hill being held in a Melbourne institution, as the appropriate facility in Apollo Bay, conducted by Otway Health, has not been professionally able to comply with the bail conditions that Ms. McGarvie applied to Paul's future home?

The CEO responded that Council is not able to help with this enquiry. It's not appropriate for Council to comment and nor do I think we could provide you with a correct or full response. The nature of your questions relates to decisions made by the justice system and need to be directed there.

2. Does the timber industry compensate the consumers for any real or perceived loss in quantity or quality through pollution in trucking of its water supply?.

The Mayor responded that there is no requirement to do this and no, they do not.

Amended plans

- Prior to commencement of the development, amended plans to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority must be submitted to and approved by the Responsible Authority. When approved the plans will be endorsed and will then form part of the permit. The plans must be drawn to scale with dimensions and three copies must be provided. The plans must be generally in accordance with the plans submitted with the application, but modified to show:
 - a) Provision for five (5) bicycle spaces.
 - b) Provision of an additional 59.5sqm of loading and unloading area(s).
 - c) Dimensioned elevations, to scale, of the vehicle entry checkpoint.

Endorsed plans

2. The development as shown on the endorsed plans must not be altered without the written consent of the Responsible Authority.

Consolidation of titles

3. Unless otherwise approved by the Responsible Authority, within six (6) months of the commencement of development, Lot 1 and Lot 2 PS413157 must be consolidated under the provisions of the Subdivision Act 1988 to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.

Landscaping

4. Prior to commencement of the development, a landscape plan to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority must be submitted to and approved by the Responsible Authority. When approved, the plan will be endorsed and will then form part of the permit. The plan must be drawn to scale with dimensions and three copies must be provided. The landscaping plan must be generally in accordance with the Stage 3 Plan (TP1.03.2), except that the plan must show:

a) a planting schedule of all proposed trees, shrubs and ground covers, including botanical names, common names, sizes at maturity, and quantities of each plant adjacent to the western site boundary with Clark Street and within the proposed car parking area.

All species selected must be to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.

5. Within three months of the date of the commencement of any part of the development hereby permitted, or by such later date as is approved by the Responsible Authority in writing, the landscaping works shown on the endorsed plans must be completed to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority. The landscaping must thereafter be maintained to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority, including that any dead, diseased or damaged plants are to be replaced.

Access

6. Prior to the commencement of the development hereby permitted, a detailed design showing the new heavy vehicle entrance/exit on Flaxmill Road, which must be generally in accordance with the 'Flaxmill Road Entry Works Plan' prepared by MacLeod Consulting (Dwg No. C20 - Rev PD - Feb 2016), must be submitted for approval to the Responsible Authority. When approved, the plan will be endorsed and will form part of the permit. Within 6 months of the commencement of the development hereby permitted, or such other timeframe as is agreed in writing by the Responsible Authority, all works associated with the creation of the new heavy vehicle entrance/exit on Flaxmill Road must be undertaken in accordance with the endorsed plans to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.

Car Park Construction

- 7. Prior to the commencement of the development hereby permitted, the area/s set aside for the parking of vehicles as shown on the endorsed plans must be:
 - a) constructed:
 - b) properly formed to such levels that they can be used in accordance with the plans;
 - c) surfaced with crushed rock or gravel and treated to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority to prevent dust;
 - d) drained;
 - e) appropriately marked to show designated parking spaces;
 - f) properly illuminated with lighting designed, baffled and located to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority to prevent any adverse effect on adjoining land;

to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.

The areas must be constructed, and drained to prevent diversion of flood or drainage waters, and maintained in a continuously useable condition to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.

Car spaces, access lanes and driveways must be kept available for these purposes at all times.

8. Within 3 years of the initial occupation of the development hereby permitted, unless alternative surfacing is formally approved in writing under this permit or endorsed as part of a Development Plan or separate planning application by the Responsible Authority, the car parking area hereby permitted must be surfaced with an all-weather seal coat, to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.

Internal Roads

9. All new internal roads, and loading/unloading areas, hereby permitted must be surfaced with an all-weather seal coat, drained and clearly marked to show the direction of traffic to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.

Stormwater

10. All runoff from stormwater, including overflow from water storage, must be taken to a Legal Point of Discharge to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.

Amenity

- 11. The development hereby permitted must be managed so that the amenity of the area is not detrimentally affected, through the:
 - a) transport of materials, goods or commodities to or from the land;
 - b) appearance of any building, works or materials;
 - c) emission of noise, artificial light, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, waste water, waste products, grit or oil;
 - d) presence of vermin.
- 12. The buildings and works hereby permitted, including any associated plant and equipment, must be constructed and maintained to ensure compliance with State Environment Protection Policy (Control of Noise from Commerce, Industry and Trade) No. N-1 (SEPP N-1) and/or Noise from Industry in Regional Victoria (EPA publication 1411, October 2011), as applicable.
- 13. Buildings and works hereby permitted must be constructed of muted, nonreflective colours and materials, to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.
- 14. The buildings and works hereby permitted must be maintained in good order and appearance to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.
- 15. Any external lighting on the development hereby permitted must be designed, baffled and located so as to prevent any adverse effect on adjoining land to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority.
