PURPOSE in relation to Council's intention to set the Mayoral and Councillor

Allowances at the Ordinary Council Meeting on 24 May 2017.

2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council must review and determine the level of the Mayoral and Councillor Allowances within the period of 6 months after a general election or by the next 30 June, whichever is later.

Council resolved at the Ordinary Council Meeting on 22 February 2017 the intention to determine at the Ordinary Council meeting to be held on 24 May 2017 the Mayoral and Councillor allowances in accordance with section 74 and section 223 of the Local Government Act 1989 to be:

a) Mayoral Allowance - \$ 71,748 b) Councillor Allowance - \$ 23,709

Prior to Council resolving the level of allowances after a review, Council is required to undertake a s223 process under the Local Government Act 1989. Section 223 of the Local Government Act 1989 provides an opportunity for a person to make a submission on various documents and processes that Council undertakes.

Advertisements were placed in the local paper on Monday 27 February 2017 and again on Friday 3 March 2017. Submissions closed on Friday 7 April 2017 which allowed 6 weeks for submissions. One submission was received.

3. RECOMMENDATION

That Council having received and noted the written and verbal submission, refers the submission for further consideration to the Council meeting to be held on Wednesday 25 May 2017, as part of Council's deliberations in considering its final decision on Mayoral and Councillor Allowances.

4. BACKGROUND / KEY INFORMATION

BACKGROUND

Current Allowances

The allowance payments currently being made to Councillors are as follows:

Mayor: \$71,748 (in addition a superannuation allowance of \$6,816 is also payable)
Councillors: \$23,709 (in addition a superannuation allowance of \$2,252 is also payable)

These allowances may be further increased as a result of a review of allowance ranges and limits by the Minister as required under section 73B of the Act from time to time.

Payment of Allowances

The payment of Mayoral and Councillor Allowances must not exceed one month in advance. This was changed from 27 October 2012.

The Councillor Support Policy provides for the payments 4 weeks in arrears.

Review

Council must review and determine the level of the Councillor allowance and the Mayoral allowance within the period of 6 months after a general election or by the next 30 June, whichever is later. (Section 74 (1) *Local Government Act 1989*).

Section 223 Process

Prior to Council resolving the level of allowances after a review, Council is required to undertake a s223 process under the *Local Government Act 1989*.

Section 223 of the *Local Government Act 1989* provides an opportunity for a person to make a submission on various documents and processes that Council undertakes.

The Council must provide an opportunity for written submissions to be provided for a period of at least 28 days. The Colac Otway Shire Council Community Engagement Policy of January 2013 recommends a six week submission period however shorter time frames may be appropriate depending on the circumstances related to external deadlines.

As part of this process any person who has made a written submission to the Council and has requested to be heard in support of their written submission is entitled to appear in person or by a person acting on his or her behalf before a meeting of the Council or a Committee of Council established for this purpose.

At the Ordinary Meeting of Council on 22 February 2017 Council resolved that Council:

1. Gives public notice of its intention to determine at the Ordinary Council meeting to be held on 24 May 2017 the following Mayoral and Councillor allowances in accordance with section 74 and section 223 of the Local Government Act 1989:

a) Mayoral Allowance - \$ 71,748 b) Councillor Allowance - \$ 23,709

- 2. Appoint a Committee comprising of all Councillors and chaired by the Mayor in accordance with section 223(1)(b)(i) of the Act, to meet on a date to be determined, and hear any persons who in their written submissions under section 223 of the Act have requested that they be heard in support of their submission.
- 3. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to undertake any and all administrative procedures necessary to enable Council to carry out its functions under section 223 of the Act.

Advertisements were placed in the local paper on Monday 27 February 2017 and again on Friday 3 March 2017. Submissions closed on Friday 7, April 2017 which allowed 6 weeks for submissions. One submission was received.

KEY INFORMATION

Submissions closed on Friday 7, April 2017 which provided interested persons 6 weeks to lodge their submission. In relation to the matter being considered by Council one submission was received and the submitter has requested that they be heard in support of their written submission.

7. IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

DETAILS

The Order in Council has set down the current level of Councillor Allowances and a review of allowances must be completed within the period of 6 months after a general election or by the next 30 June, whichever is later.

Once the level of allowances were recommended at the Ordinary Council Meeting on 22 February 2017 a public consultation process was undertaken. Submissions and a report on the proposed allowances are now to be considered with final adoption proposed for the May 2017 Ordinary Council meeting.

COMMUNICATION

Council advertised its intention to review Mayoral & Councillor allowances in accordance with the requirements of the *Local Government Act 1989*. This was undertaken in the local newspaper and on Councils website.

TIMELINE

Mayoral and Councillor Allowances will be considered at the Ordinary Council Meeting on the 24 May 2017 and it is anticipated that the new allowance levels would take effect immediately thereafter.
